

## About meemoo, Flemish Institute for Archives

Working alongside cultural, media and government organisations, meemoo provides expert services, knowledge and advice for the preservation and use of digital and other archives. Together with its partners, the Flemish Institute for Archives brings the past back to life and prepares this content for the future, safeguarding it digitally and ensuring it remains accessible and usable. Specifically, meemoo digitises and archives Flemish audiovisual and other content for over 180 partner organisations. Besides, meemoo offers a digital intake process for the digital collections of its content partners, and pays attention to metadata. At the moment, more than 7.5 million objects have found their way into the meemoo archive system.

Meemoo makes this valuable content accessible to various target groups and through various platforms. You can search through descriptions of over 1.8 million audiovisual items at [hetarchief.be](http://hetarchief.be). At that same platform, partners are able to let their visitors watch and listen to image and sound archived by meemoo on site with them. At [artinflanders.be](http://artinflanders.be) you can view and download high-quality images of works of art from Flemish collections. The Archive for Education audio and video content is also available for teachers (in training) and pupils in secondary education to use in the classroom. Furthermore, meemoo supports organisations and artists with information and assistance through knowledge-sharing platforms such as CEST and TRACKS, and by collaborating on projects and answering approximately 300 requests for advice from the field each year.
